It is that time of the year again for our Annual Book Fair. It is always extremely popular and does promote great interest in reading amongst the children. The books have arrived at school and the fair





This is a great night of fun and enjoyment for the family that is run in conjunction with our Book Fair. It will take place on the evening of **Thursday 3rd September** –


start time 6:30pm
