**Emergency Situation** 

Means of communication for help – mobile phone

Sickness – paracetamol, removal from island at low tide or emergency half tide with life jackets and only for injured and teacher

Emergency vehicles – boat, car, ambulance, helicopter, helpers

Emergency Procedures – defining the roles of adults, meeting point

Meeting points clearly defined before departure, specify place reference for school/emergency services Teacher to administer first aid, adults to stay with pupils and one to assist teacher

Emergency first aid book carried

Driver/adult is in control of

group until teacher is present

Phone for emergency assistance, next family, then notify the chairperson and principal Record incidences in school's accident register
