

Blended Learning Strategies – Example

Strategy	Content	Activities	Communication	Assessment
<p>1. Provide an opportunity for students to consolidate practical skills they were shown in class.</p>	<p>i. Teachers create videos of demonstrations of practical skills.</p> <p>ii. Upload videos to the class Youtube channel.</p> <p>iii. Teacher guides student re items to look for, and questions to prompt students' thinking.</p>	<p>i. Students view the videos using the guide and questions from the teacher.</p> <p>ii. Students practice skills in groups, and provide feedback to each other.</p> <p>iii. Each group prepares a summary of what their group did, what was learned, and tips about the practical skill – share online.</p>	<p>i. Students share information about the practical skill - discussion group (Moodle or google email group), Facebook, twitter, group or personal blog.</p> <p>ii. Teacher provides feedback to each group using the technology chosen by the group.</p>	<p>i. Students work in pairs or group of four to create a video of themselves demonstrating the practical skill.</p> <p>ii. Each pair or group provides a summary of the relevance of the skill to the specific practice area.</p> <p>iii. Teacher provides feedback on the skill and the summary.</p>

*This can also include strategies for interaction – student-content, student-student, student-lecturer.
