Risk Management Strategies	Normal Operation	Ratio of 1: 4 Clear instructions given before every surf group session Setting boundaries Care of others with surfing runs Setting up roles for helpers Knowledge of medical /special needs problems No entering water unless permitted by teacher Set depth level ie belly buttons Set line up – surf club roof Listen to instructions from helping adults A First Aid Certificate person Roll call frequently	Take First Aid kit Wearing appropriate clothing – wetsuit, togs and after surf wear Keep boards tethered to arms Hard top boards kept to edge of group	Appropriate consultation over surf conditions – if in doubt stay out Sun safe rules apply Watch of changing surf conditions Stay away from wildlife	
Risk Management Strategies	Emergency Situation	Means of communication for help – mobile phones Emergency vehicle Double arm waving from adult on beach means all leave water Raise one arm if in difficulty in water Emergency Procedures – defining roles of adults – all out of water children kept together by an adult Adult to remain with group – teacher to attend to situation
