The class teacher may conduct activities such as story telling, ▶ read aloud, book talks/discussions, competitions (book review writing, reading, story telling, news reading, book jacket/bookmark/poster designing, developing a story, etc),

assembly programmes ► (book reviews, stage conversations based on book themes, dramatizations, puppets), awards (best reader of the class), exhibitions/displays, preparation of wall magazines, scrap books, etc

Develop Language Skills

▶ Introduce the book.

Tell about the book, but don't give away the ending!

Tell about your favourite part of the book or make a connection.

Give a recommendation (e.g., If you like..., you will love this book or I recommend this book to anyone who likes...).

Tour to the main library: For primary students to make them aware of library, books and reading. The librarian's Role: Support the class teachers to set up class libraries and organize related activities/events.

A "Reading Corner" in the Primary block containing newspaper multiple copies of children's magazines Purpose : open/anytime reading.

in – charge : Head Master/Mistress.

"Hanging Libraries" in class I-III

children's magazines and donated books clipped and hanged on a thread in the class room.
