1.1 INTRODUCTION



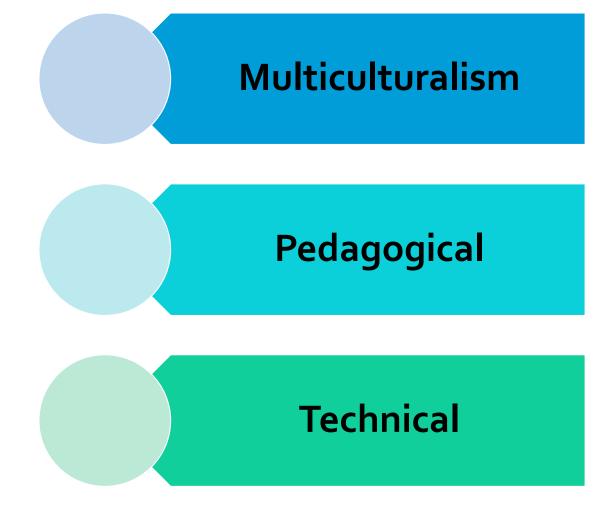
ICT security issues and concerns are becoming more prevalent and increasingly complex as the pace of technology implementation continues to accelerate.

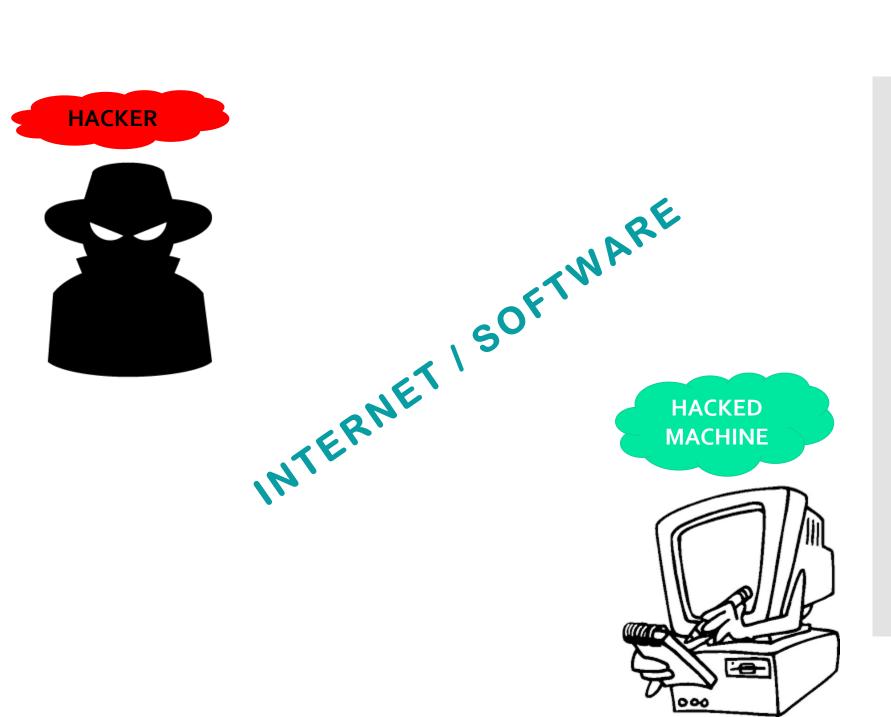
1. HACKING

Hacking is an attempt to exploit a computer system or a private network inside a computer. Simply put, it is the unauthorised access to or control over computer network security systems for some illicit purpose.

COPYRIGHT

Copyright infringement is the use of works protected by **copyright** law without permission, infringing certain exclusive rights granted to the **copyright** holder, such as the right to reproduce, distribute, display or perform the protected work, or to make derivative works.

CONSEQUENCES

The legal **penalties for copyright** infringement are: Infringer pays the actual dollar amount of damages and profits. The law provides a range from \$200 to \$150,000 for each work infringed. Infringer pays for all attorneys fees and court costs.

COPYRIGHT vs PLAGARISM

The two are similar in some aspects, however the two are distinctively different.

Plagiarism is claiming attribution for a work you did not author, or using someone else's work without proper attribution.

Copyright infringement is using someone else's work without obtaining their permission.
